2025 Redfish Music Festival Locations



The Redfish Music Festival, founded in 2021 by Fritz Gearhart, is an annual celebration of classical chamber music. Named after the nearby Redfish Rocks Marine Reserve, this vibrant festival brings world-class musicians to perform concerts in coastal cities from North Bend to Brookings, Oregon.

At the festival's core is an intensive week-long program, where students receive personalized training from a faculty of internationally renowned artists. These acclaimed musicians also captivate audiences with their virtuosic performances.

The Redfish Music Festival presents classical concerts throughout the year, ensuring the southern Oregon coast is treated to exceptional live music. With its blend of educational opportunities and public performances, the festival is quickly establishing itself as a must-attend event for classical music lovers.

North Bend

Nestled along the southern Oregon coast with a rich maritime history, it once thrived as a bustling port town in the late 19th century. Today it draws visitors with its proximity to the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area, where expansive sand dunes offer opportunities for off-roading and hiking. History enthusiasts will enjoy the Coos History Museum, which showcases the area's maritime and indigenous heritage. Those looking for this photo's gorgeous vista can visit Shore Acres State Park on Cape Arago.



Port Orford

As the oldest town on the Oregon coast, Port Orford has deep ties to the fishing industry. Visit the rugged coastal cliffs and panoramic views at Port Orford Heads State Park, along with its famed lifeboat station. History and nature converge at Battle Rock Park, where you can learn about the area's local lore. Redfish Rocks Marine Reserve (namesake of RMF) invites adventurers to explore its thriving marine life, making it a perfect spot for kayaking.





Bandon

Founded in the late 1800s, Bandon was once a key hub for the timber industry and is now known for its stunning coastal views and vibrant artistic culture. Visitors flock to its beaches, famous for its dramatic sea stacks, awesome sunsets, and iconic landmark at Face Rock State Scenic Viewpoint. History buffs can explore the Bandon Historical Society Museum or shop in the charming Old Town district.



Langlois

The small rural community of Langlois, rooted in farming and logging, offers a peaceful retreat for visitors. Hike and windsurf at Floras Lake State Park or take a scenic drive along the Wild Rivers Coast. The famed Langlois Cheese Factory and its legacy live on in the surviving historic barn. Visit this local favorite venue for live music, dancing, weddings, and community events, seen above with RMF in 2024.



Gold Beach, named after the gold discovered in the Rogue River during the 19th century, boasts a rich mining history. The Rogue River provides opportunities for fishing and thrilling jetboat tours. For breathtaking ocean views, visit Otter Point State Recreation Site or explore the pictured shoreline along the Samuel H. Boardman State Scenic Corridor.



Brookinas

The southernmost city on the Oregon coast, Brookings is known for its lush forests, mild climate, and magnificent coastline. Harris Beach State Park is a standout destination, offering beautiful beaches, picnic areas, and tidepools perfect for exploration. Drive inland to enjoy the incredible scenery along the Oregon Redwoods Trail, pictured above.
